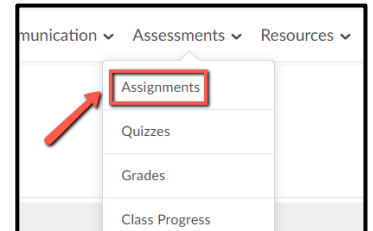




# Viewing Assignment Feedback on D2L

1) From the course navigation bar, click **Assessment** and then click **Assignments**.



2) Once you have located your desired assignment, click **Unread** in the Evaluation Status column.

3) From the View Feedback page, you can view your teacher's

feedback, which may include a **score, text feedback, rubric assessment, attachments, and/or inline feedback.**

a) If your instructor added an annotated feedback file to the assignment, click **View Inline Feedback**. The annotation feedback file opens in a new tab, displaying annotated feedback on a PDF file that may include highlighting, free hand drawing or shapes, text comments, and pop-up notes. To download the annotated assignment as a PDF, click **Download**.

b) If there are any feedback files, click Download All Files to download feedback attachments.

## Troubleshooting Assignment Feedback:
